



Lorrell "Pete" Peterson Set to Retire After 37 Years of Service



Lorrell 'Pete' Peterson has spent over 37 years of his life serving the customers of South Central Public Power District as an Apparatus Technician and Lineman. His time at South Central PPD will come to an end in early February when he officially retires.

Pete joined South Central PPD in October of 1985 as an Apparatus Technician/Lineman. Pete attained his Journeyman Lineman certificate in 2000.

During his time at South Central PPD, Pete developed a skill set to maintain, repair and upgrade the many meters, breakers, capacitors, regulators and substation equipment needed to keep electric service available. He was involved in the transition from mechanical to electronic metering and experienced first-hand, the many changes made to the technology used to provide power. Pete was also responsible for substation construction and maintenance.

For most of his years, Pete was involved with load control for the irrigation services supplied by South Central PPD. As the equipment used for load control continued to change and evolve, Pete was involved in the change-outs and ongoing maintenance of that equipment.

Pete graduated from Nelson High School in 1976 and attended Morningside College in Sioux City, Iowa on a football scholarship. Pete and his wife Maggie made their home in Nelson and raised 4 boys. Pete played fast-pitch softball for the Oak Athletics softball team for many years. He was also heavily involved in coaching his sons' sports teams and spent much of his time attending their activities.

Pete's wife, Maggie, is currently the Deputy Treasurer at the Nuckolls County Courthouse in Nelson. She has worked there for the past 24 years. Maggie is set to retire in late January.

Pete and Maggie's family has grown significantly over his time at South Central PPD. Their 4 boys have all married, adding 4 daughter in-laws, 7 grandchildren and two more grandchildren on the way.

Their son Kirk, lives in Ainsworth, NE with his wife, Chelsey and their children, Gracyn and Brock. Kirk owns Peterson Asset Protection and Chelsey works for Farm Credit Services of America. Andy lives in Lawrence, NE with his wife, Maddie and their son, Reece. Andy is a 5th grade teacher at Lawrence/Nelson Elementary School and Maddie works at Brodstone Healthcare.



High Efficiency Heat Pumps	TO BE ANNOUNCED AT A LATER DATE
Attic Insulation	 Increase incentive from \$0.15/sq. ft. to \$0.30/sq. ft., maximum attic space remaining at 2,000 sq. ft. Maximum incentive increases from \$300 to \$600.
Commercial HVAC	TO BE ANNOUNCED AT A LATER DATE
HVAC System Optimization	Eliminate need for contractor to be put on list of Service Providers
Lawn & Garden	Chainsaws, tillers, and snow blowers are now eligible for a 20% incentive.
Electric Vehicle	EV incentive will only be offered through the end of 2022.
Pre-Wiring for EV Charging Station	 Increased incentive from \$200 to \$400 for new construction Increased incentive for existing structures (100% of the cost) from a maximum of \$400 to a maximum of \$600
Commercial Charging Station	 Direct Current Fast Chargers (DCFC) must be preapproved before equipment is ordered. Charging stations must be available for public use 24/7.
Commercial Charging Station for Non-Profit Organizations	 90% reimbursement for the installation of an EV charging station. Grants, discounts, etc., are deducted to determine customer's cost. Incentive is based on the lower of two qualified bids.

Commercial Charging Station for all Businesses	 \$200/kW of charging station capacity Incentive is capped at 50% of charging station cost. DCFC: Limit of one per business location (50 kW minimum rated charging capacity) Level 2 charging stations: Up to four per business location.
Pre-Wiring for EV Charging Station	 Increased incentive from \$200 to \$400 for new construction Increased incentive for existing structures (100% of the cost) from a maximum of \$400 to a maximum of \$600
